### TIP OF THE MONTH

#### WEATHER CHANGES & HORSE BEHAVIOR

As the weather shifts and grass disappears under snow, horses adjust to new feed and routines. Take time to notice what's normal for your horse—how they eat, rest, and behave. Changes like pawing, kicking at the belly, or restlessness can signal early discomfort or even colic. If you notice something off, in your horse or another, don't hesitate to mention it—it's always better to say something than assume someone else has noticed.
